Dr Benjamin Djoudalbaye is an International health professional with extensive expertise in African context, focusing on the design, implementation, management and evaluation of Public Health programs with focus on HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis, Malaria and Ebola Virus Disease prevention, care and treatment programs, as well as maternal, newborn and child health.
